Delmy Salin is a senior economist at USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) where she develops ongoing international transportation analysis. She extensively researches agricultural transportation in Brazil and Mexico and spearheads AMS's analysis of South America's transportation systems. In partnership with the Honduran Government and other stakeholders, Dr. Salin was instrumental in designing and implementing Honduras's first-ever agricultural marketing information system. Her recent activities include the development of AMS's transportation analysis in the

Black Sea region. She began her public service career as an agricultural economist at USDA's Economic Research Service and continued as a supervisory economist at AMS. She served as vice president for research at the Food Distribution Research Society. Before joining the Federal government, Dr. Salin was an assistant professor of agribusiness at Texas A&M University-Kingsville and an international consultant. She also worked as a consultant for several international organizations in various capacities including the World Bank. She is fluent in English and Spanish and speaks intermediate Portuguese.
